Canetti was a polymath and one of the major intellectual figures of the 20th century. He is renowned for his novel Auto-da-Fé and his work of social theory Crowds and Power, as well as his volumes of autobiography."The Play of the Eyes (originally published in German in 1985) is the third volume of Canetti's wonderfully readable memoirs and covers his years in Vienna from the late 1920s to the mid-1930s.
